

ORDER
COCONINO NATIONAL FOREST
RED ROCK RANGER DISTRICT
DEER PASS TRAILHEAD and FOREST ROAD 89B AREA

SPECIAL RESTRICTIONS

Pursuant to Title 36 CFR 261.50 (a) and (b), the following acts are prohibited in areas as described in this Order on National Forest System lands administered by the Coconino National Forest, Yavapai County in Arizona, and as depicted on the attached map, hereby incorporated into this Order as Exhibit A.

PROHIBITIONS:

1. Camping in the restricted area; **36 CFR 261.58(e)**.
2. Being in the restricted area after 8:00 p.m. until 8:00 a.m.; **36 CFR 261.58(l)**.
3. Building, maintaining, attending or using a fire, campfire, charcoal, coal, or wood stove within the restricted area; **36 CFR § 261.52(a)**.

EXEMPTIONS:

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50 (e) the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty; and
2. Person(s) with a Forest Service permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
3. The use of pressurized liquid or gas stove is permitted.

AREA DESCRIBED:

This order affects the Coconino National Forest, Red Rock Ranger District T17N R4E Sections 35 and 36 and T16N R4E Sections 11 and 12 as shown on the map in Exhibit A. The restricted area includes the area known as Deer Pass Trailhead and Forest Road 89B located in Yavapai County. The boundary of the restricted area at Deer Pass Trailhead begins at the junction of State Route 89A and the west side of the fenced City of Sedona property on the section line dividing Sections 35 and 36; then follows the east side of SR89B southwest for 0.7 mile; then east 0.6 mile; then north 0.3 mile to the southern boundary of the fenced City of Sedona property; then following the fenced City of Sedona property boundary to SR89A. The restriction also includes National Forest land where Forest Road 89B parallels Oak Creek from the southwest corner of the private property in Section 12; then southwest 0.6 mile to 0.25 mile past the end of road 89B in Section 11; then southeast 0.2 mile across Oak Creek; then northeast 0.8 mile to the southern boundary of the private property in Section 12; then along the private property boundary to the southwest corner of the private property.

PURPOSE:

This order is needed to protect public health and safety to the threat of wildland fire and to protect sensitive riparian plant and wildlife resources.

IMPLEMENTATION:

1. This Order will be in effect when signed and shall remain in effect for two years from the date of signature or until rescinded, whichever event occurs first.
2. This Order rescinds, replaces and supersedes any previous Orders prohibiting the same acts covered by this Order in that area addressed by Exhibit A.
